Our new fly-In, floating Headwaters Safari Camp will take your Amazon adventure to new heights. You will now be in the heart of the world's largest rain forest in prime fishing waters away from the main, large tributaries.

A peacock bass fishing adventure to Brazil's vast and untamed Amazon basin is truly one of the most memorable angling experiences found anywhere on the planet. For many, this will be the closest opportunity you'll ever have to encounter the unique sights, sounds and smells of the world's largest rain forest. Peacock Bass Adventures desires to further intensify this unique jungle experience for our anglers to a far beyond what has traditionally been available with most outfitters. We desire to offer you an

Amazon fishing adventure that will define the true jungle fishing experience. We will enjoy the experience of extremely comfortable, remote safari-style camps located in the headwaters of two rivers that cannot be accessed by any other outfitters. You will be fishing the scenic and fertile fishing waters of either the Rio Alegria (a remote headwaters tributary of the Cuini), or another productive river headwater system. These highly mobile, air-conditioned comfortable safari barges will offer you a genuine jungle feel, as you will enjoy tranquil nights nestled within the rainforest.

Each day, you will explore the pristine Rio Alegria and its numerous hidden lagoons, oxbow lakes and other plentiful fish-holding structures with your experienced guide. The Rio Alegria Headwaters Safari Camp is located 280 miles northwest of Manaus. Our headwaters camp was designed to provide first-class accommodation and privacy for those preferring more adventurous settings and closer contact with the Amazon rain forest. The locations we will take you to will offer the rare opportunity to fish pristine waters for trophy class peacock bass, far removed from the often crowded waters of the Rio Negro. This mobile, air-conditioned camp, one only accessible by float plane, will soon set the "gold standard" and define the true meaning of Amazon fishing adventure.

9 days (including travel days) / 8 nights / 6+ days of fishing

Headwates Safari Camp Requirement:

The Headwates Safari Camp package requires a \$1000.00 (US) per angler deposit. Bookings are not confirmed until deposits are received. Deposits are due within 10 days of making a tentative reservation. Final payments are due 60 days prior to your departure.

Travel Logistics to the Headwates Safari Camp:

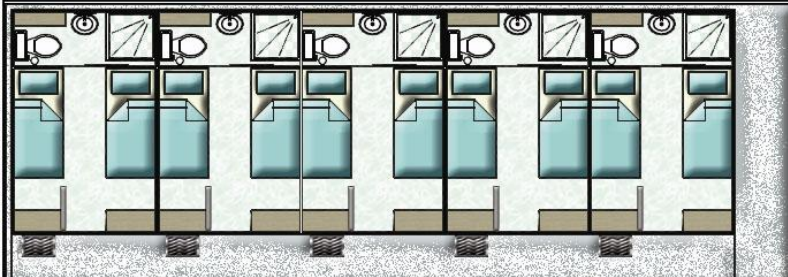


Anglers fly during a Thursday evening flight via Delta Airlines from Atlanta directly to Manaus, Brazil. After clearing customs and immigration, you'll be met by our representatives and taken to a hotel for some shut-eye. Early the next morning, you will be transferred to the local airport for your float plane charter flight to the fly-in headwaters safari camp. Fishing will begin after meeting the camp manager and settling in to your room and receiving an orientation for the week. It is anticipated you will be fishing this first afternoon, but the fishing this first day will be determined by the charter flight schedule. The pilots are very safety conscious and will not fly in storms. Your safety is our primary concern. You will have six full days of fishing after this arrival day.



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Accommodations at Headwates Safari Camp:

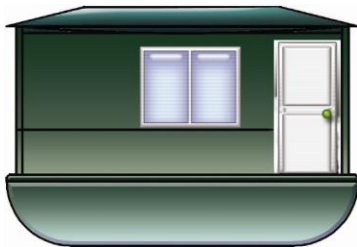


The Fly-In floating safari barges (seen in photo at above) will allow you to fish and experience the Amazon in comfort.

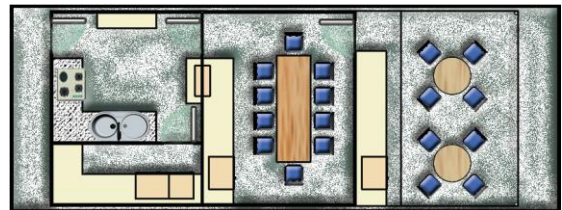
Anglers will be treated to very comfortable air-conditioned rooms aboard a floating barge, one needing only four-inches of water to navigate up or down the rivers you will fish depending on fishing conditions and productivity. Each room will offer two anglers a bathroom and shower facility. Non-stop power generators ensure the electricity the camps. Since our groups are small, the bilingual host and his

staff offer unique personalized hands-on attention. A satellite phone (a fee will apply) is just one of the available amenities. What you won't find are many annoying or biting insects. The rivers we fish and their tributaries have naturally-high tannin levels (from extensive leaf decay) which discourage the development of biting insects.

Meals at the Headwates Safari Camp:



The separate dining area / canteen follows the same style and look as the sleeping facility. It is spacious, comfortable and air-conditioned. An excellent variety of both continental and exciting regional dishes, make up the week's menu.



Selections may include fish, chicken, beef and pasta. Freshly baked breads and pastries are made daily and chilled wines, ice-cold beer, soft drinks, and Brazilian-style margaritas flow freely throughout your fishing trip. You will typically make your own box lunch to eat during a mid-day siesta. The guides will pack the lunch in the coolers aboard the fishing boats.

Availability at the Headwates Safari Camp:

As the booking calendar changes on almost a daily basis, please contact our office for current availability on your specific travel dates.

Official Language at the Headwates Safari Camp:

Portuguese is the official language of Brazil. Some of the guides can converse in Spanish, however, and know a few basic English words, especially as they pertain to fishing. It is wise to learn a few Portuguese or Spanish phrases before undertaking a trip of this nature. If you are fairly fluent in Spanish, you will have no difficulty communicating with your guide. Anglers booking this trip will be sent a 100-page Complete Peacock Bass Angler text, which will contain a basic English-Spanish-Portuguese translator. An English-speaking host will always be on the premises at Headwates Safari Camp. The guides are all willing to please and the language barrier is quickly overcome.

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The Fishing at Headwates Safari Camp:



You will be treated to quality boats, trolling motors and experienced local guides.

You will be fishing main river structure, as well as a multitude of lakes, backwater bays and hidden lagoons. The typical fishing day is long (we figure you can rest back in the states) and runs from 6:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Anglers are paired two to a boat with an experienced Brazilian guide. The boats are 21- feet long, have stable raised casting decks, swivel seats, 40-HP outboards and electric trolling motors. These boats can cruise over shallow sandbars and flats and get you into places that other, heavier, fiberglass boats

cannot reach. The fishing boats will possess life jackets, first-aid kits, and an icebox for cold drinks and snacks. One of the most

appealing and exciting aspects of fishing for peacock bass is their propensity for attacking surface lures and flies. The strike is so dramatic that you will be startled when the first few occur. Peacock bass fishing is very similar to largemouth bass fishing in the states. Both species ambush prey from cover and structure. Cast topwater plugs, jerkbaits, Banjo Minnows and jigs to stumps, shoreline blowdowns, points, creek mouths and sandbars. This region is most productive following the rainy season, as the rivers, creeks and lagoons recede and the fish are drawn out of the maze of trees, root systems and lush vegetation. Keep in mind that the productiveness of your peacock bass adventure is largely dictated by the water levels, and occasionally the rainy season fails to abide by schedules and may add mid-season downpours.



One of the finest compliments ever given to our guides recently came from one of our clients – Doug Youngblood (seen at right with angler Chris Cagle who is holding a trophy peacock bass), a former Bassmasters Classic competitor and, himself, a full-time professional fishing guide of some 20 years on Lake Lanier, Georgia – who was simply astounded at what the guides would do for their guest anglers. “I couldn’t believe my eyes when, in the course of just one day on the water, I saw our



guide cut trees with his machete that lay toppled across a narrow creek that blocked our access to one of his private lagoons; then watch him climb a tree to retrieve a badly cast lure and then nervously sat in the boat as I observed him dive in the water to un-snag a trophy peacock we had hooked that became entangled in a tree some five feet below the surface,” said Doug. “I’ve never seen any guides –

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anywhere, anytime - work so hard to make sure their clients are taken care of. And that's just not one or two of the guides I fished with – that's every one of them." These carefully trained guides are hard core sport fishermen themselves, who are intimately familiar with the complexities of peacock bass fishing in the Amazon. Many have guided American anglers for 10 years or more. With thousands of fish boated for clients, they'll put you onto big numbers of big fish like no one else in the Amazon. They are all eager to show you a fantastic adventure, welcoming you to their Amazon home. Each boat will have a certified Boga-Grip scale in case you catch the next world record.

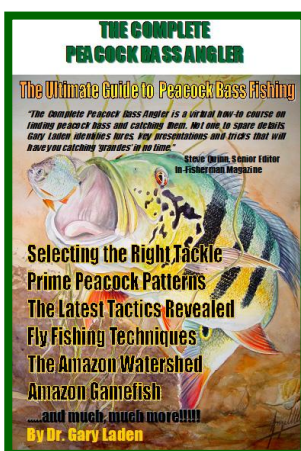
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Weather at the Headwates Safari Camp:

The Headwaters Safari Camps are located in the Amazonas region of Brazil and the weather at each is typically hot and humid, with temperatures ranging from 75 degrees overnight and in the early morning hours to the mid-nineties during the day. It is advised that visiting anglers consider long sleeve tropical weight shirts and long tropical weight pants to keep you protected from the equatorial sun's powerful rays. A wide brim hat is also recommended, as is a quality sunscreen and lip balm in the 30 to 45 SPF range. Even though we schedule your trip during the Brazilian dry season, showers and storms can occur, so please pack a rainsuit as the temperatures drop during these periods of rain.

Packing for Headwates Safari Camp:



Upon receipt of deposits, you will be sent a detailed packing list, as well as other literature pertaining to medical precautions and other information regarding your trip. You will also receive a 100-page Complete Peacock Bass Angler text that will brief you on packing and peacock bass techniques and patterns. Headwaters Safari Camps offer quality rods and reels. A lure pack will be offered at the beginning of the trip. Anglers will be asked to purchase "perishable" items, such as jigs and Banjo Minnows, which tend to be readily destroyed by peacock bass or snagged within



cover. Anglers may elect to bring any lures they may desire to bring. We can arrange for complete tackle outfitting if desired. Fly anglers, however, are asked to bring their own tackle as this gear is highly specialized and quite costly to replace or repair.

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Headwaters Safari Camp Itinerary:

Saturday: Evening international evening flight to Manaus, Brazil on Delta Airlines.

Sunday: Midnight arrival in Manaus. Transfer to hotel to spend the night. Early in the morning, charter float planes for flight to the Headwaters Safari Camps. Fishing begins if there is no problem reaching camp early due to weather or other logistical factors.

Monday-Saturday: Six days of fishing

Saturday: Charter back to Manaus. Day accommodations at Hotel Tropical in Manaus. Approximately an 11 PM departure to Atlanta. Arrive in Atlanta approximately 5:30 AM. Connection to your home city.
